PANEL 1: Noun Essentials (Quick Recap)

A noun is the name of a person, place, thing, quality, or action.

Type	What it is	Exam Examples
Proper	Specific names (Capitalized)	India, Rohan, Godavari
Common	General class/category	Boy, city, river, candidate
Collective	Group of individuals/things	Jury, committee, herd, fleet
Material	Substances/matter	Iron, wood, gold, water
Abstract	Feelings, concepts, states	Bravery, honesty, childhood

Smart Tip: Exams rarely ask for definitions. They test how verbs and articles interact with these noun types.

PANEL 2: The "Uncountable" Trap (High Yield)

These nouns cannot be counted physically. They must follow strict rules:

- They take a **Singular Verb**.
- NEVER use *a/an* before them.
- NEVER add *s/es* to make them plural.

Top Exam Words: Scenery, Poetry, Furniture, Advice, Information, Hair, Luggage, Mischief, Bread, Machinery.

-  **Incorrect:** The *sceneries* of Himachal are beautiful.
-  **Correct:** The **scenery** of Himachal **is** beautiful.
-  **Incorrect:** He gave me many *advices*.
-  **Correct:** He gave me much **advice** (or *many pieces of advice*).

PANEL 3: Deceptive Nouns (Singular vs. Plural)

A. Looks Plural, Acts Singular

End in 's' but are single entities. Take a **Singular Verb**.

Words: News, Mathematics, Physics, Innings, Summons, Measles, Billiards.

-  **Incorrect:** The news *are* fake.
-  **Correct:** The news **is** fake.
-  **Incorrect:** India won by an *inning*.
-  **Correct:** India won by an **innings**.

B. Looks Singular, Acts Plural

Do not end in 's' but represent a group. Take a **Plural Verb**.

Words: Cattle, Cavalry, Infantry, Poultry, Peasantry, Children, Police.

-  **Incorrect:** The cattle *is* grazing.
-  **Correct:** The cattle **are** grazing.
-  **Incorrect:** The police *has* arrived.
-  **Correct:** The police **have** arrived.

PANEL 4: Paired Items & Hyphenated Nouns

A. Nouns Always in Plural (Paired Items)

Tools or clothing made of two identical parts take a **Plural Verb**.

Words: Scissors, Trousers, Spectacles, Binoculars, Scales.

-  **Incorrect:** Where *is* my spectacles?
-  **Correct:** Where **are** my spectacles?

(Note: To make it singular, use "A pair of spectacles is...")

B. The Hyphenated Noun Rule

When a noun with a number acts as an adjective modifying another noun, it remains **Singular**.

-  **Incorrect:** He gave me a five-hundred-**rupees** note.
-  **Correct:** He gave me a five-hundred-**rupee** note.
-  **Incorrect:** We went on a ten-**miles** walk.
-  **Correct:** We went on a ten-**mile** walk.

PANEL 5: Word Formation (Airforce X & Y Special)

Airforce exams frequently ask candidates to identify or form the correct noun from a verb or adjective.

Root Word	Noun Form	Root Word	Noun Form
Brave (Adj)	Bravery	Know (Verb)	Knowledge
Decide (Verb)	Decision	Poor (Adj)	Poverty
Advise (Verb)	Advice	True (Adj)	Truth
Grow (Verb)	Growth	High (Adj)	Height
Live (Verb)	Life	Accept (Verb)	Acceptance



PANEL 6: The Apostrophe ('s) Cheat Sheet

Rule 1: Living vs. Non-Living

- Use **'s** for living things, time, and distance. (*Correct*: Ram's book, A day's leave)
- Use **of** for non-living things.

 **Incorrect:** The table's wood.

 **Correct:** The wood of the table.

Rule 2: Plural Nouns Ending in 's'

- Add only the apostrophe ('), not another 's'.

 **Incorrect:** The boys's hostel.

 **Correct:** The boys' hostel.

Rule 3: Compound Nouns

- The **'s** goes at the very end.

 **Correct:** Commander-in-chief's orders.
